Eligibility and Selection Criteria

- ❖ Current secondary-level, full-time teachers of English, English as a Foreign Language (EFL), math, science, or social studies (civics, history, geography, global studies, etc.), including special education teachers in those subjects at institutions serving primarily a local population
- ❖ Bachelor's degree or equivalent
- ❖ Five or more years of full-time teaching experience
- ❖ Demonstrated oral and written English language proficiency
- ❖ Citizen and resident of participating Fulbright TEA country
- ❖ Other requirements as indicated in the application
