# Secretary Blinken's Call with Acting Haitian Prime Minister Joseph

Secretary of State Antony J. Blinken spoke with Acting Haitian Prime Minister Claude Joseph today [July 7]. Secretary Blinken extended condolences to the family and loved ones of President Moïse and to the people of Haiti. The Secretary also expressed the United States' wishes for First Lady Martine Moïse's recovery. Secretary Blinken reiterated the United States' continued commitment to work with the Government of Haiti in support of the Haitian people and democratic governance, peace, and security.





**Haiti continues to have the highest (Level 4) [Travel Advisory](#), “do not travel.” We strongly encourage those U.S. citizens who are in Haiti to avail themselves of the opportunity, given the reopening of airports to commercial flights, to depart Haiti, especially if they feel at risk or threatened in any way.**

**The Embassy is extremely limited in its capacity to respond to U.S. citizens in distress throughout the country. Consequently, U.S. citizens must rely primarily – and potentially solely – on local authorities and resources for assistance.**
